"Help, they are killing me!" —Boubacar Bah, a 52-year-old man from Guinea, who died in ICE custody after detention guards, despite concluding that he was in medical distress, left him in an isolation cell without medical treatment for more than 13 hours.

Just like Boubacar Bah, over 1.7 million people have passed through the U.S. government's web of secretive immigration detention facilities. Those detained have no guaranteed right to a lawyer and many face mandatory detention—their liberty deprived with no right to a fair hearing. People are held in prisons and jails that are so poorly managed rampant human rights abuses occur daily.

- We demand that President Obama put an end to human rights abuses in detention centers
